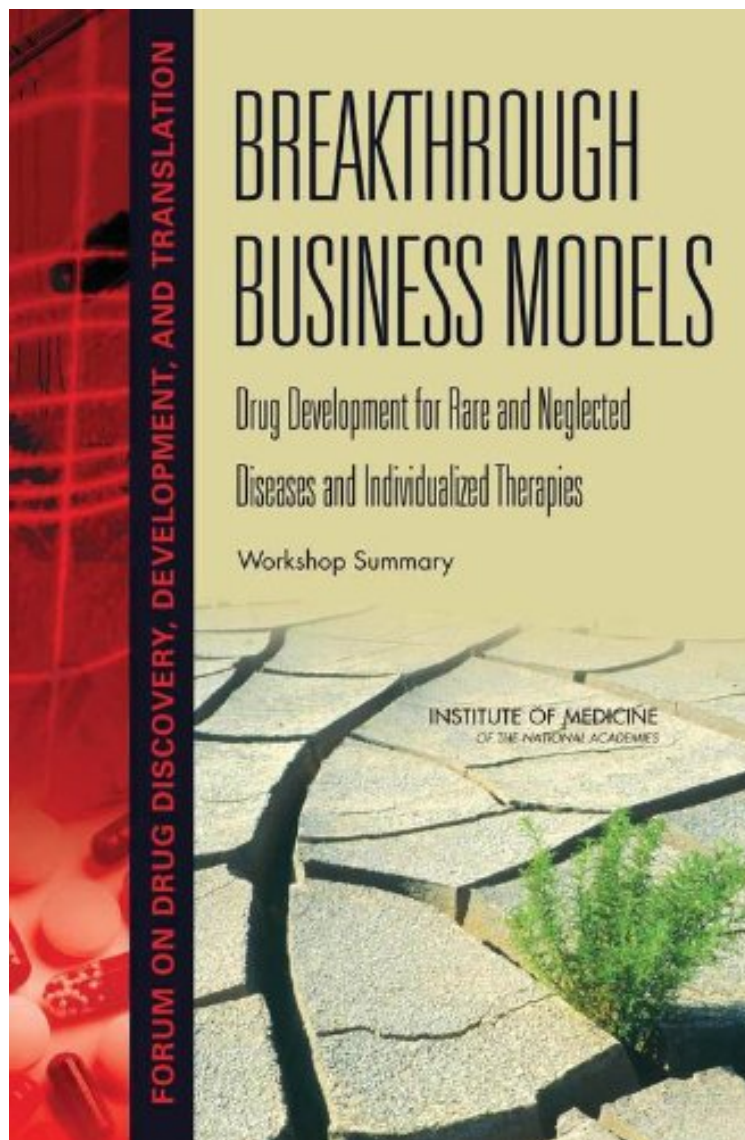

The process for developing new drug and biologic products is extraordinarily expensive and time-consuming.
