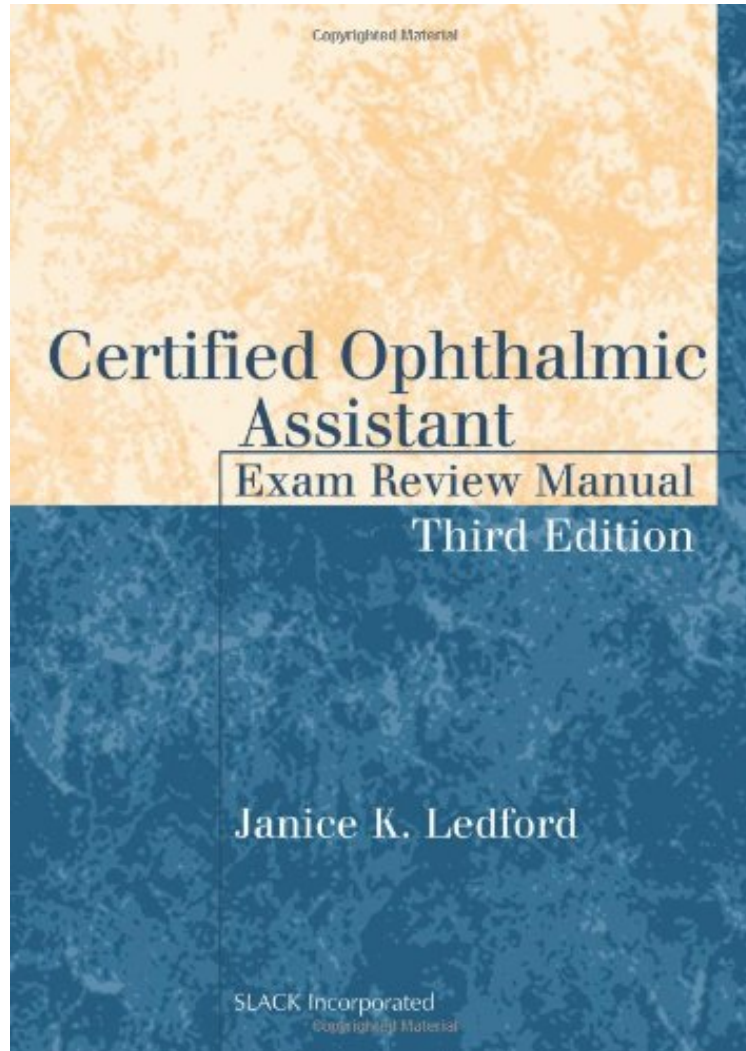

It was broken down into the chapters that JCAHPO has on the exam, the heaviest weighted chapters having the most test questions. I feel that by using this book along with the 9th edition of The Ophthalmic Assistant: A Text for Allied and Associated Ophthalmic Personnel helped me pass the COA on the first try. This manual phrased the questions almost identically to the questions on the actual exam, and even better, has an answer guide at the end of each chapter explaining why the answer is correct. You

Some questions are quite annoying because they reflect the personal opinion of the author or have otherwise "subjective" answers, but those few questions are easy to recognize and discount if you "don't agree". Plan to spend MUCH MORE TIME working through this version of Ledford's Review compared to her previous versions. Some chapters/sections are soooooo long that they can seem like insurmountable mountains for some people with limited time or who may find it difficult to concentrate for hours at a time. For me, I was able to progress quicker after I broke the long chapters down to several 100-question sections. Doing that helped me keep making progress after getting stalled. Definitely take time to read the all of the ANSWERS completely because the author excels in giving much needed information in her explanations to each question. If you can learn the information in this book, you should definitely be able to pass the exam - though the exam is still challenging enough to require more than this resource if you aspire to scoring 90-100% on every section of the exam. I passed the exam in March 2017 with 100% on 10 sections and 90% on 6 sections (there was a total of 19 sections). For an inexpensive, quick, high-yield study resource I also used Alex's COA Study Guide eBook - (from theophthalmictechnician) which was very, very helpful in learning the most important required information for each section and in reinforcing that information through frequent quick reviews of his short tests. To really prepare at the highest level, it is necessary to study text books along with these two very valuable resources.
