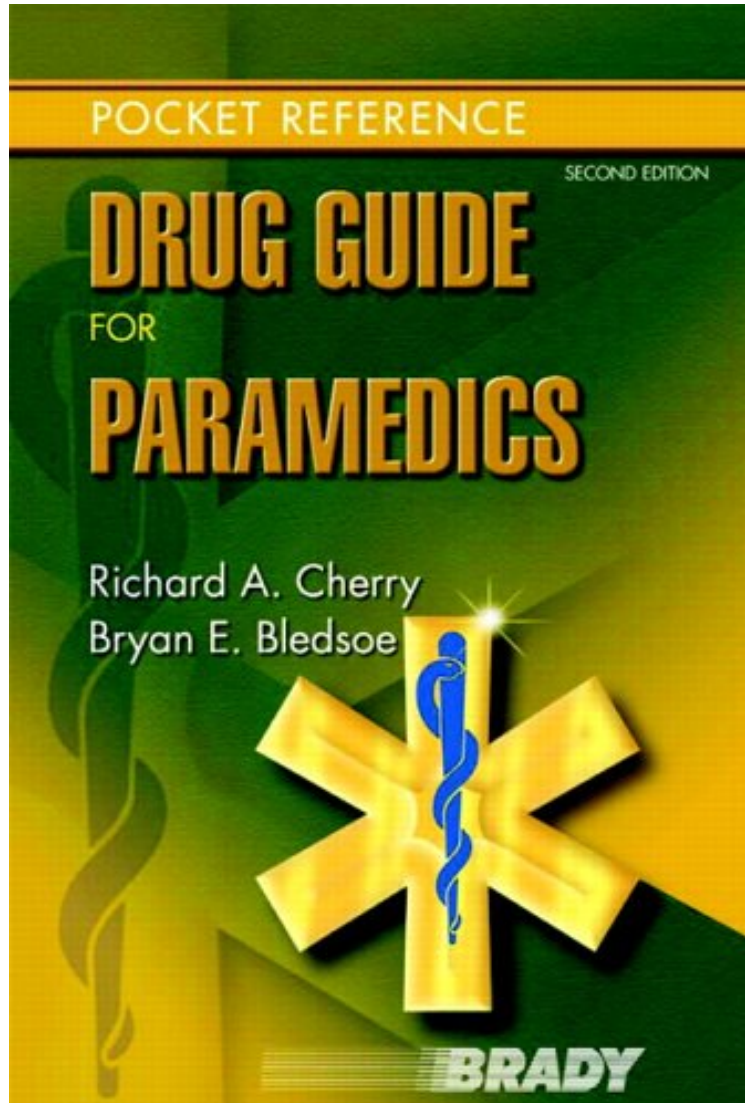

Cherry and Bledsoe Paramedic textbooks have a habit of not updating medication dosages despite AHA (American Heart Association) ACLS and PALS updates. After owning this pocket guide for two years, it has survived well. The only damage is the edges of the front cover becoming fuzzy. Simply use clear (not opaque) tape and seal the edges.The 2nd edition is less convenient to handle because of the side binding, and much

more difficult to flip through if your glove size is anything above a small.
