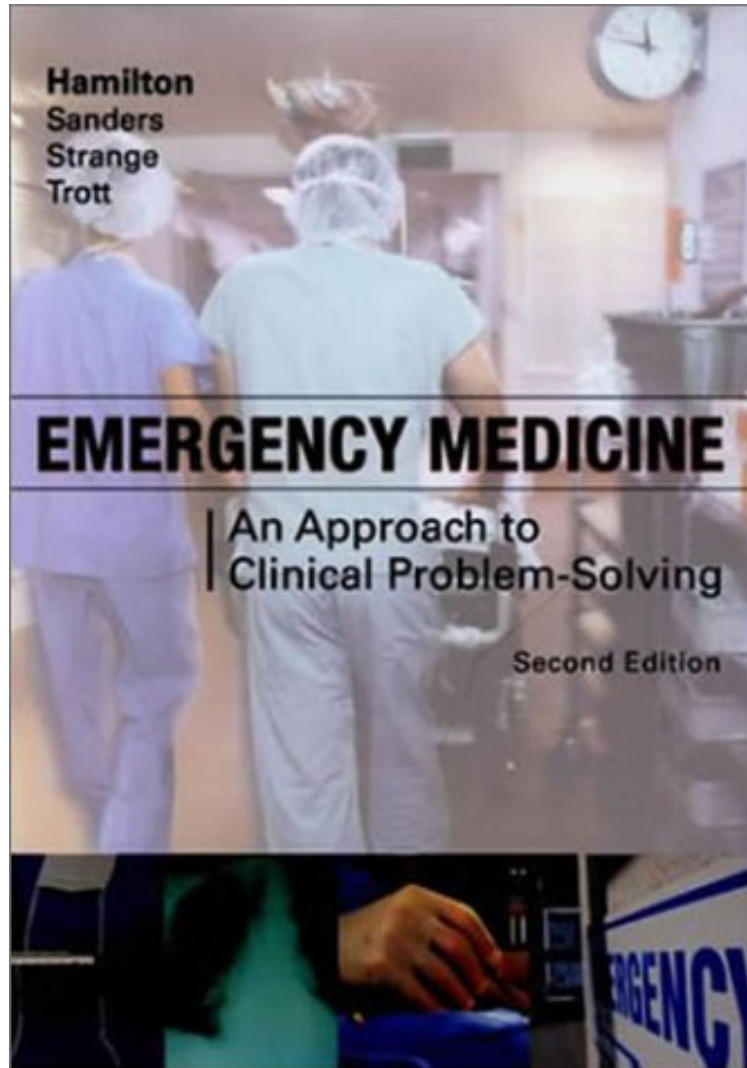

This text is required reading for the clerkship that I just finished in emergency medicine. It is 900 pages of redundant, poorly explained, outdated material that leaves me no better informed than when I first began. A quick comparison of this book with Titinalli reveals that Hamilton's chapters are overly long, yet do not do any better of a job of explaining relevant material. The book seems to use a looped approach

to teaching: that is, a subject is introduced from start to finish (history, physical, and treatment) and then re-discussed and finer detail of history, physical, and treatment. In the end, I end up spending well over an hour per chapter to read something that takes me only 10 minutes in Titinalli. Also, some of the information in this text is outdated. The ACLS guidelines go against what the first few chapters of this book teach. It is important for a textbook to stay current and to have regular updates using the latest available literature. I would recommend that a person use either "An Introduction to Clinical Emergency Medicine" or Titinalli. 0 of 0 people found the following review helpful. It is 900 pages and has many good pictures and diagrams. The index is very good as well. For a quick reference when there is not extensive time to research a topic, as well as for a straight read, this book is solid.
