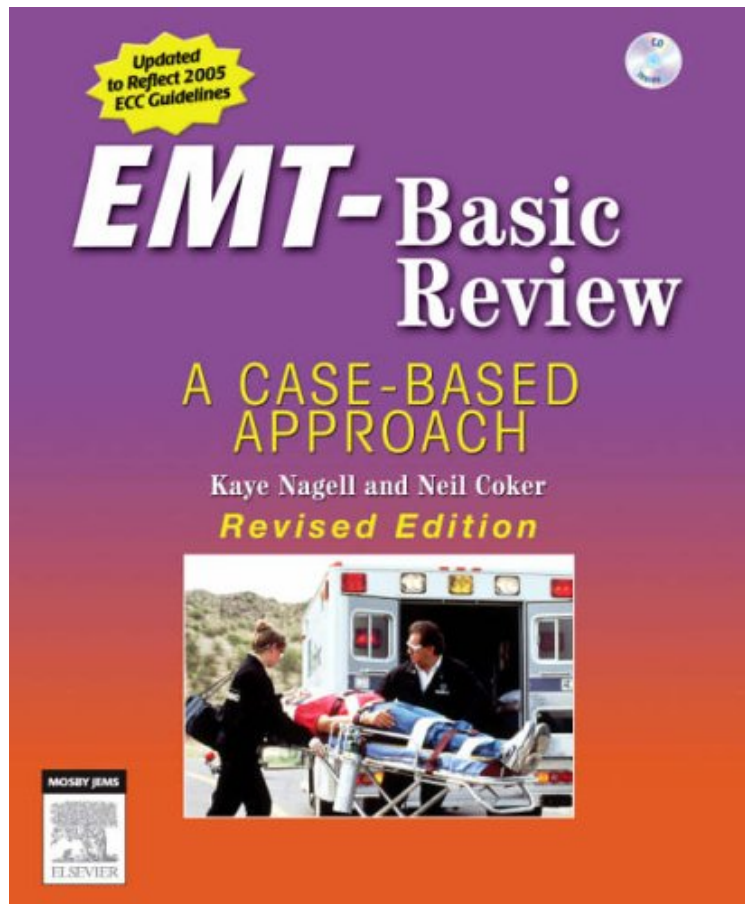

Sets down the steps from arriving

on the scene, ensuring your PPE's are on, Scene Size-up, Initial Assessment, checking Mental Status, ABC's, Determining Priority, etc. Also provides exams and a step-by-step flow sheet for both trauma and medical patients. If you're unsure how to put it all together, this is the book for you.
