At first I thought it was a serious book because it contains references. I realized later that the references are almost entirely citations of various dictionaries, including online-only dictionaries that I've never heard of, as well as citations of other textbooks and various non-peer-reviewed editorials in obscure journals. The chapters are very short and cursory. It is pretty much useless. Even the preface of the book makes clear that it is written for people with no background in science. What the book doesn't mention is that it's written in an incredibly lazy way. By far the worst textbook I've ever read.
