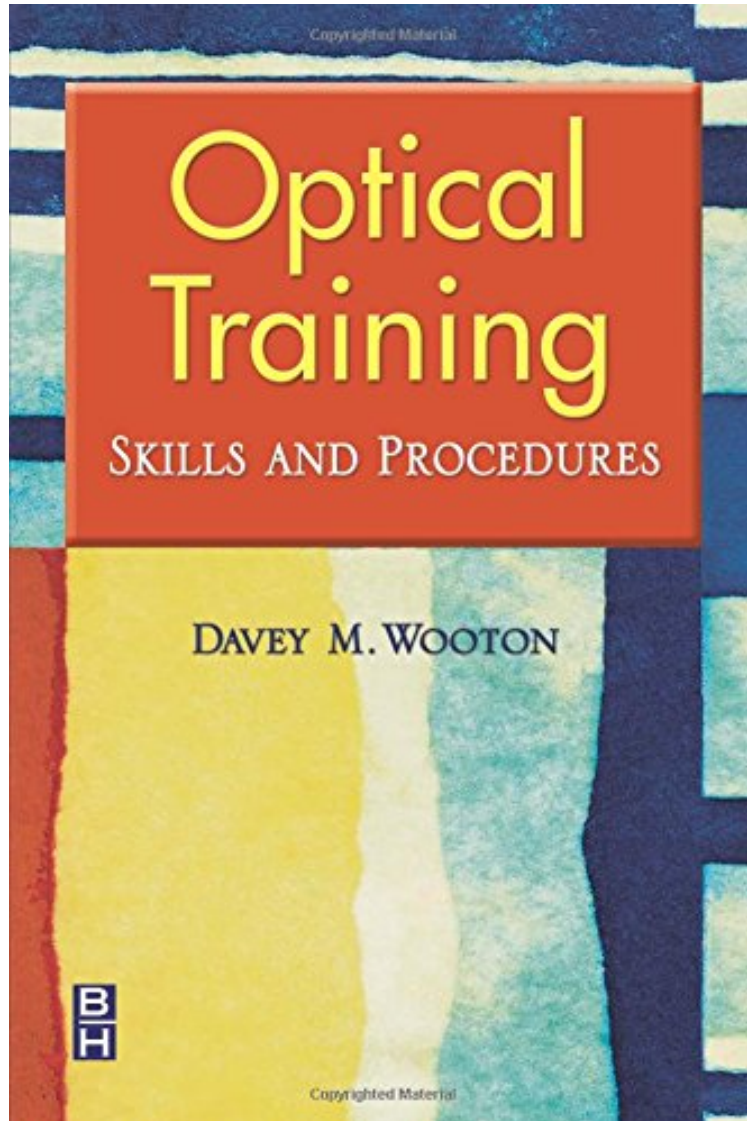

wrong. Definitely not meant for ABO study material. The illustrations are so poor it's disgusting. They have pictures of different face types and they all look like unrecognizable blobs. Then when showing prism there wasn't even an effort. It literally has stick figure heads with a triangle over the eyes showing the different prism types. If you are a new optician learning the very basics this book will just be material you'll learn within your first week on the job and is definitely not worth the money.
