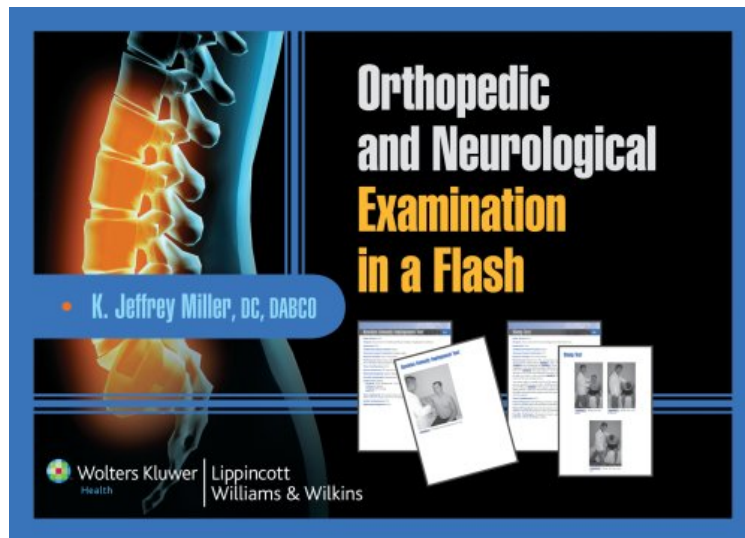

I couldn't even bring myself to use them as "Flash Cards" as honestly, they are really nicely done, I would not want to lose a card or two (or more) and generally, I hate tearing up my stuff. (Yes, I'm still working on that aspect of my "attached-ness!") I thought Dr Miller should have made them a book, but that would make a pretty fat book. Hence my solution, comb-binding the set into 2 halves (color copied the box front as a cover to each half). Vol 2 now starts at pg (card) 203 - Seated Shoulder Tests. I also comb-bound them at the top of the card so as to not lose any text. Another great reference is Ronald C Evans' Instant Access to Orthopedic Physical Assessment. That one is soft bound, I would recommend comb-binding it as well. (I ring-bound mine, and after some years, I wish I had comb-bound it, for the sake of having a "spine" on it that I might label. These 241 quick-reference flash cards cover all the standard orthopedic and neurological tests that all chiropractors, physical therapists, physicians, and nurses need to know. The card for each test includes confirmatory tests and the confirmatory tests also have cards. Consistent headings on each card include other names of the test; purpose; equipment; recommended patient position; traditional position; alternate patient position; performance; time considerations; normal response; abnormal response; possible pathologies; confirmatory tests; test replicated; useful combinations; and differential diagnosis. Each card also includes a photograph of how to perform the test.
