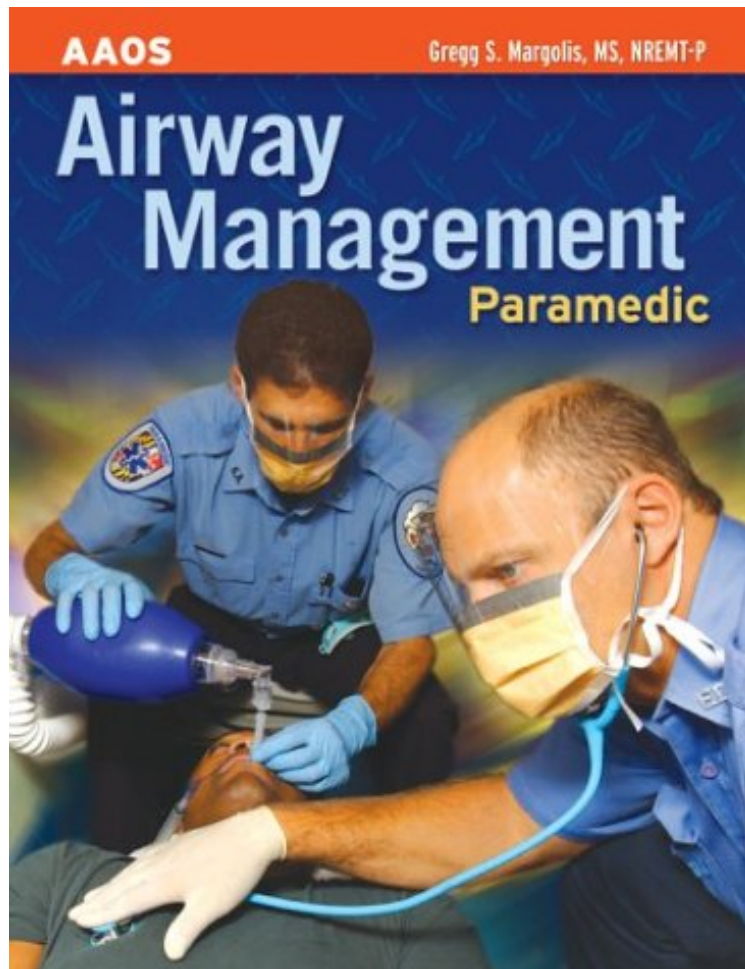

I bought this book out of frustration with other paramedic texts, eg Mosby's and Nancy Caroline. This book is written for brain damaged first aiders, who want to know more about the stuff they do on ER. It contains painfully little information. It is a waste of money to buy a whole book dedicated on airway management, and it tells you little more than the normal book. This book is written for technicians who don't need to know why they do something. And quite frankly it doesn't even have enough info to make monkey conclusions. If you are doing "Brains backyard ambulance course" then go for the book. But don't think you will be educated. It took me 3 hours to read through it. Half of the book is what I learned in first aid. I found

exactly 3 sentences that was of interest, the rest is lots of talk with no facts. It includes anatomy and physiology which should have been covered in much more detail before you learn about advanced airway management. Very disappointed. It's like the authors think paramedics are stupid, so they'll write us elementary level books. I instead bought Kovacs Airway Management in Emergencies. Can't compare. (Because it's was written for doctors) Paramedics shouldn't know anything less on airway management than doctors. I could have written this book... so don't let the pretty pictures mislead you.
